Theory and application of Corrections Officer Training. The curriculum meets State Board of Correction requirements. CPR/First Aid has been eliminated from the curriculum. This will be a department requirement. Successful completion of CPR and First Aid continues to be a requirement for all entry-level corrections officers within the first year of employment as a correctional officer. Peace Officer Orientation (832 p.c./64 hours) immediately following this course – 5/22/08-5/31/08

1. It is required that each student brings a 3" binder with a transparent cover and tabs for organization of instructor handout materials.
2. Students must wear navy blue P.T. clothing (with their A.J. t-shirt) for all physical training within the academy. There is no training scheduled for the first day of class.
3. For invoicing purposes, any sponsoring agency must provide a letter stating whom they are sponsoring, address, phone number and contact name.
3. Each student must submit a Health/History Statement, Par-Q and a medical clearance PRIOR to participating in the physical training within this academy. An agency may submit a letter stating clearance through the background process; however, the student must still submit the Health Statement/Par-Q. Any concerns will involve future contact with that student and/or agency.
4. Daily classroom attire will consist of agency logo polo with tan, khaki slacks or uniform; non-affiliated students will wear tan khaki slacks with an A.J. logo, polo shirt that can be purchased at Sport-T's.
5. Each student will bring a penal code and a dictionary, a Title 15 will be provided.
