



Chapter 3—General Institution

AP 3500 – Campus Safety

Reference: Education Code Section 212, 67380, 87014; Penal Code Section 245; 20 U.S.C. Section 1232g, 1292(f); 34 C.F.R. 668.46; 34 C.F.R. 99.31(a)(13), (14); Campus Security Act of 1990

The Chief of Police prepares and annually updates a report of all occurrences reported to campus police of, and arrests for, crimes that are committed on campus and that involve violence, hate violence, theft or destruction of property, illegal drugs, or alcohol intoxication. The report will include all occurrences of non-criminal acts of hate violence reported to campus authorities. A written report will be submitted to the Board.

Written records of non-criminal acts of hate violence shall include at least a description of the act of hate violence, the victim characteristics, and offender characteristics, if known.

The district provides materials to students, and the Police Department maintains a web site with the Campus Safety and Parking Handbook in a PDF file on the web site.

Night Time Personal Safety Tips

- Travel with a friend or in a group
- Be alert and aware of your surroundings
- Avoid dark, vacant, or deserted areas; use well-lit, frequently traveled routes
- Dress in clothes and shoes which will not hamper movement

If you sense you are in trouble:

- Move away from the potential threat if possible
- Join any group of people nearby
- Cross the street and increase your pace
- If a threatening situation is imminent, and people are close by, yell, scream or make a commotion in any way you can to get their attention
- Go to an open building
- Use a campus emergency telephone of 9-1-1



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
