
General Scholarship Fund

(any major)

Albin Sluzalis Memorial Scholarship Fund – Merit-based scholarship demanding a 3.5 cumulative grade point average. Student must be from Yuba County and planning to transfer to a school in the UC or CSU systems.

Amar Kaur and Gurpal Singh Bains Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship recognizes student merit (3.0 GPA) and is given to a student whose academic record indicates that s/he intends to transfer to a four-year college or university.

David and Katherine Conroy Scholarship – The Conroy Scholarship is one of few scholarships available strictly for the purchase of textbooks. This scholarship supports students of all majors who have faced economic or social barriers to achieving a higher education.

Elmer and Clemmie Stohlman Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship supports students in the fields of education or radiological technology. It also recognizes those who failed to complete high school, but subsequently completed their GED and enrolled in college. Recipients are expected to maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0.

Faculty Association Scholarship – This scholarship goes to entering students who have demonstrated both community involvement and a bent toward academic excellence while in high school. A 3.0 cumulative GPA is required.

Gavin Mandery Scholarship – Recognizes a former Marysville mayor and community leader who believed strongly in transfer education. Must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA and be transferring to a four-year institution.

Gurpal Singh Bains Memorial Scholarship – Also merit-based, this scholarship recognizes students transferring to four-year schools and having a 3.2 GPA (or better). Volunteer work related to the Sikh community is helpful but not essential.

Harold Sawtell Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship recognizes a 2.75 GPA as the threshold for initial eligibility. The applicant must maintain a 2.75 and be enrolled in at least six semester hours of coursework. Students may apply for the Sawtell straight out of high school.

Hayter-Kimmerer Memorial Scholarship – The Hayter-Kimmerer Scholarship is a rigorously competitive award that emphasizes ongoing achievement. While the student may qualify with a 2.5 GPA, they must maintain strict academic standards in order to maintain the scholarship. This scholarship recognizes the role of former K-12 educator Alice Dewey, who was a major influence on the success story of the donor.

Kewal Singh Nagra Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship, which targets primarily students from underrepresented populations, recognizes a combination of need and academic excellence (3.0 GPA). Students should demonstrate an academic track record leading to transfer.

Yuba College Faculty Scholarship – This scholarship recognizes progress both in meeting transfer education goals and in earning a competitive GPA (3.0). Students must be enrolled full-time to be considered for this scholarship.

Mary Rai Scholarship – This scholarship, which targets primarily underrepresented populations, recognizes a combination of need and academic achievement. This is primarily a transfer-based scholarship and is given to a graduating sophomore. Mary Rai and her daughter Leela Rai continue to be longstanding supporters of Yuba College.

Scott Evan Chew Memorial Scholarship – This scholarship is awarded to a transfer student upon his/her completion of their major and is applied toward their funding at a four-year college/university. Financial need is the primary criteria by which candidates will be judged.

Yuba City Women's Club Scholarship – This general scholarship, donated by the last members of the Yuba City Women's Club, recognizes students who have been enrolled at Yuba College for at least a year. Such a student must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA and is not required, necessarily, to transfer.

Yuba College Classified Scholarship – This scholarship is available annually to a student selected by the classified staff for support. The scholarship balances need and achievement.

Yuba College Foundation Scholarship – This scholarship is designed for re-entry students who have served in the military and/or been employed for several years in the workplace. It has a 2.5 GPA requirement, but is primarily need-based.
