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**Background and Status: On February 14, 1990, the Yuba College Board of Trustees adopted a Minimum Qualifications List to become effective July 1, 1990 pursuant to AB 1725. Part of this Legislation requires that the Minimum Qualifications List be reviewed annually. On October 22, 2004, the Academic Senate submitted an addendum to the previous documents.**

Re: Minimum Qualifications Adoption

The Yuba Community College District Academic Senate proposes that the Board of Trustees adopt the "Minimum Qualifications for Faculty and Administrators in California Community Colleges" as submitted by the Chancellors' Office in March 2003 with the following modifications:

**READING:**

(additions in italics)

Master's in education with a specialization in reading or teaching reading **OR**

Bachelor's in any academic discipline **AND** twelve semester units of course work in teaching reading, *to include (1) basic theory in teaching reading, (2) language acquisition, (3) diagnosis and assessment of reading problems, and (4) secondary and/or college reading instruction*, **AND** Master's in English, literature, linguistics, applied linguistics, composition, comparative literature, TESL, or psychology **OR**

The equivalent

**STATISTICS:**

(to be added to the Chancellor's list as a separate entry)

Master's in mathematics or applied mathematics, which must include at least six semester units of either upper division under-graduate or graduate course work in either statistics or probability **OR**

Bachelor's in either of the above **AND** Master's in statistics, physics, or mathematics education, which must include at least six semester units of either upper division under-graduate or graduate course work in either statistics or probability **OR**

The equivalent

**COMPUTER SCIENCE:**

(changes in italics)

Master's in computer science or computer engineering **OR**

Bachelor's in either of the above **AND** *Master's in mathematics, engineering, physics, computer information systems, information science, or cybernetics* **OR**

The equivalent

These modifications, along with the "Minimum Qualifications for Faculty and Administrators in California Community Colleges" as submitted by the Chancellors' Office in March 2003 will become the current "Yuba Community College District Minimum Qualifications for Disciplines Requiring the Master's and Disciplines in Which the Master's Degree is Not Generally Expected or Available."
