ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSIONS

It is the STUDENT'S responsibility to meet ALL criteria to be eligible.

There is NO deadline for submission of application. Applications are received year-round and waitlist numbers issued accordingly. Currently, there is a 3-4 year wait to enter the ADN program **after** the application has qualified.

Submission of completed application and signed contract (pages 6 and 7) are required. Applications may NOT be submitted until ALL prerequisites for the program have been completed. OFFICIAL college transcripts **MUST** be submitted **WITH** the application. (Even if you have previously submitted transcripts to Yuba College, you MUST obtain a new OFFICIAL transcript to attach to your application). Official, sealed high school/G.E.D transcript must be included with the application unless a degree is reflected on your college transcripts.

You should request **official** transcripts from all other colleges attended to be sent directly to you. Do NOT open these transcripts when you receive them. Attach the transcripts (in their sealed envelopes) to the application. When you have ALL official transcripts to verify that you have completed the prerequisites, you should submit/mail the application and transcripts to the Yuba College – Nursing Department. Applications submitted without OFFICIAL transcripts **attached** will be RETURNED to the student.

Yuba College offers an Associate Degree in Nursing program designed to prepare students to take the National Council of Nursing Licensing Examination leading to licensure as a registered nurse. This is a full-time program. It is strongly recommended that applicants complete **all** General Education courses (see page 2) prior to admission in order to devote more time and study to the nursing courses. Some classes will be taught at the Marysville campus and some at the Woodland campus. Applicants need to be aware that they will be required to travel during the program.

Enrollment each year is limited in the Associate Degree in Nursing program. Yuba College has an established waiting list for qualified applicants for the program. New applicants who are qualified for admission will be mailed a contract by the Nursing Department. After the contract is returned to the Nursing Department, the applicant's name will be placed on the wait list – from which qualified applicants will be admitted to the class from their order on the wait list.

Applicants are responsible for meeting ALL requirements for placement on the wait list. To be eligible for the wait list, applicants MUST:

1. Complete the enclosed Yuba College Associate Degree in Nursing application.
2. Obtain an OFFICIAL transcript of COLLEGES attended (do NOT open sealed envelopes) and ATTACH it to the application.
3. Have successfully completed a high school course of study. Education equivalent to HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION may be established in conformance to the regulations established by the Board of Registered Nursing.

4. Have completed with a grade of “C” or higher, the following courses or their approved equivalents – [all courses must be completed and official transcripts (in a sealed envelope) attached to your application]:
 - a) Introductory Chemistry (Chem 2A or 2B)
 - b) Intermediate Algebra (Math 52 or higher)
 - c) Nursing 26, Pharmacology (Application will be accepted without completion but must be completed prior to enrollment in Nursing 30, the first semester of the ADN Program).

***REQUIRES CUMULATIVE GPA OF 2.5 OR HIGHER**

- d) Biology 4, Human Anatomy;
- e) Biology 5, Human Physiology;
- f) Biology 6, Microbiology;
- g) English 1A, Reading & Composition

See individual course description for prerequisites to the prerequisites.

5. When an applicant is admitted from the wait list, the applicant will be required to provide the following to the Nursing department before the semester begins: (forms will be mailed by the Nursing Department):
 - a. Physical exam (at the student’s expense);
 - b. A Personal Data Form and Health History;
 - c. CPR certification (Healthcare Provider from American Heart Association or Professional Rescuer from Red Cross)
6. Student must be able to meet physical requirements specified by clinical agencies with which the Nursing Department has contractual agreements for clinical learning experiences. Additional, students are required to pass a criminal background check and drug screen.

All students will need to commute during the program and, therefore, need to carefully consider the human and financial costs of the travel. The District will NOT provide transportation to any site.

Applicants who have met the criteria will be placed on a wait list – from which applicants will be offered admission to the classes. Applicants will be offered a space in the class based on his/her wait list order until the class has been filled. Qualified applicants will be offered admission up to the first day of class if space becomes available, based on their placement on the wait list.

When you are admitted to the program from the wait list, the courses listed below will need to be completed in addition to the nursing classes in order to be eligible to take the Board of Registered Nursing Exam as an Associate Degree in Nursing (RN) applicant. It is strongly recommended that these courses be completed before entering the Nursing program. Nursing courses will NOT be scheduled around your General Education classes taken during your enrollment in the Nursing program. College courses must be completed with a “C” or higher grade:

1. Speech 1 or 6
2. F&CS 10
3. An approved Humanities G.E. course
4. Psychology 1A
5. Sociology 1 or 2 or Anthropology 2
6. Nursing 36, Pathophysiology

APPLICANTS SHOULD REVIEW ALL REQUIREMENTS TO MAKE SURE THAT ALL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA HAVE BEEN MET PRIOR TO SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION.

Individuals who have been convicted of felony crimes and some misdemeanors may be ineligible to take the state NCLEX exam which graduates must pass to obtain licensure as an RN. It is strongly recommended that those with criminal records contact the Board of Registered Nursing before applying to the Nursing Program.

CONTRACT

I understand that I will be assigned a wait list number after my nursing application has been received, processed, and eligibility confirmed by the Nursing Department office. This contract must be signed and submitted as part of the application process.

I am aware that placement on the wait list is based upon achieving the annually set overall score on the State Chancellor’s formula. I am aware that the findings of the drug screen and criminal background check may impact my eligibility for clinical placement. I understand that I must pass the pre-admission exam with the minimal cut score in order to be considered for admission into the program.

I understand that it is my responsibility to keep the Department of Nursing directly informed of any changes in name, address, or phone number. I understand if postal correspondence fails to reach me due to a wrong name or address, and a designated timeframe is missed, my name will be dropped from the wait list.

I understand that I may defer admission into the Nursing Program one (1) time when notified of acceptance and still maintain my place on the wait list. The deferment will be for one (1) semester. A second deferment will result in my name being removed from the wait list. I will need to re-apply for admission and a new wait list number will be issued to me.

I understand that if I receive an acceptance letter, confirm my acceptance, register for class, and then request a deferment, my name will go to the bottom of the wait list.

I understand that it is my responsibility to check the Department of Nursing webpage, at least monthly, and the Yuba College catalog to check for any program changes. If any changes are noted, I will contact the Department of Nursing or Counseling Department to discuss any implications this may have on my admission and program completion.

I understand that it is my responsibility to meet with a counselor to ensure that all nursing and graduation requirements have been met. I understand that students are allowed to register in nursing courses only twice. If I withdraw or fail to complete a nursing course with an acceptable grade (CR, C or above) a second time, the result will be permanent suspension from the program. I will not be allowed to enroll a third time. This policy applies to Nursing 26 Pharmacology, Nursing 36 Pathophysiology, and all other nursing course work leading to the Associate Degree in Nursing.
