At Yuba College we are working to consolidate noted essential services within the Library and specific services within the 2100 building for nursing, police, and fire science. At this time we feel we need to keep as many people home as possible and that includes our management team. We understand there may be members of our faculty and staff that have still been coming to the campus to complete their work. We recognize this might still need to take place and are asking you to please make sure your supervisors are aware of when you will be on campus. We are also trying to limit the space of where M&O are having to do deep cleaning and if you are using your work space please pick up after yourself as they are not going in to all office spaces.

Please see the below list of essential items we are trying to move to remote:

**Food Pantry** ... We have a list of the food services available within the County. We are also moving to have a phone contact for people to place orders (much like what some restaurants are doing where people come pick up the food order outside the front door) if there is still a need.

**DSPS** is being handled online.

**Health Services** is provided through Harmony Health at North Beale Rd and flyers with phone numbers are provided to students.

**Tutoring and Veterans services** will continue to be available on line.

**Library Mon-Thur 9:00 – 6:00 pm & Fri 9:00- 4:30** We have ordered more laptops however, until we have enough Chromebooks, Lap tops, and /or computers available for students to check out we will keep the library access for Students available. These hours may change depending on the traffic we see this week.

**Building 2100 Nursing, Police Academy, Rad Tech, Fire Tech, EMT, and Vet Tech** have moved all lectures to remote learning that the accrediting agencies have approved. State mandated Labs are being held using social distancing protocols. That is, no more than 10 people (including instructors) at a time doing lab work.

Faculty or others who feel a need to work in their offices should contact their supervisor and let them know they will be on campus. All people who do go to their office to work must carry out their own trash. No additional people may accompany any of these visits to campus.

Social distancing is required at all times.
