

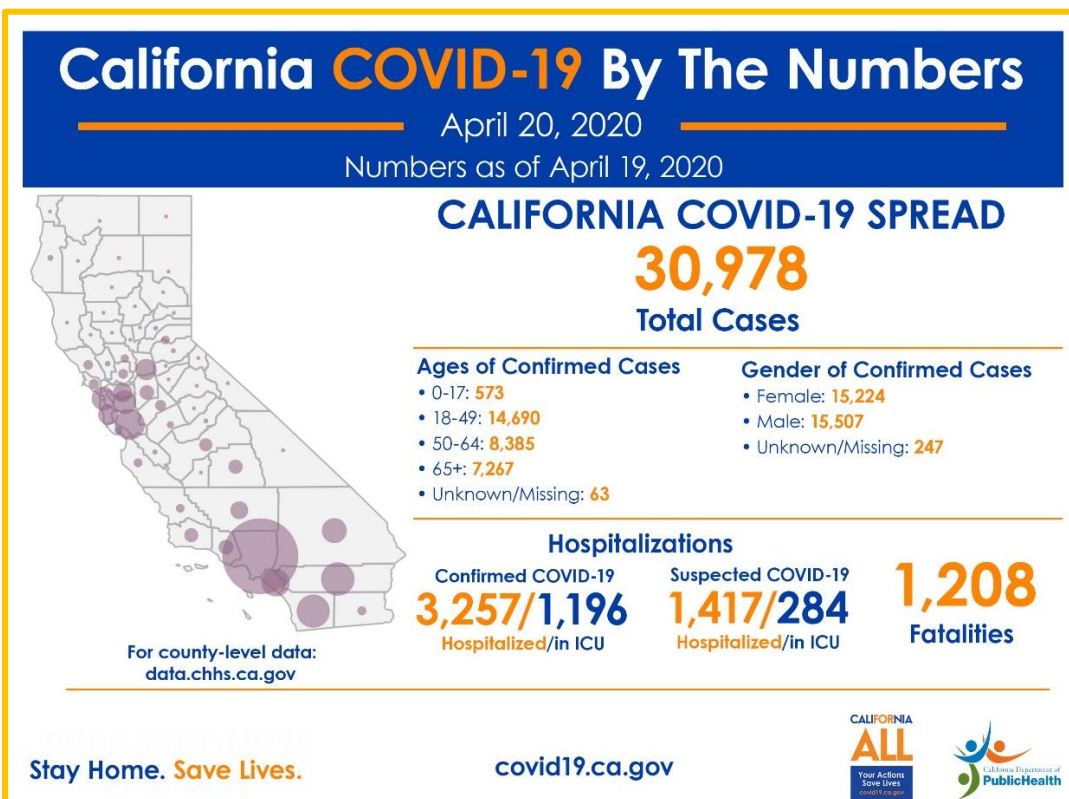
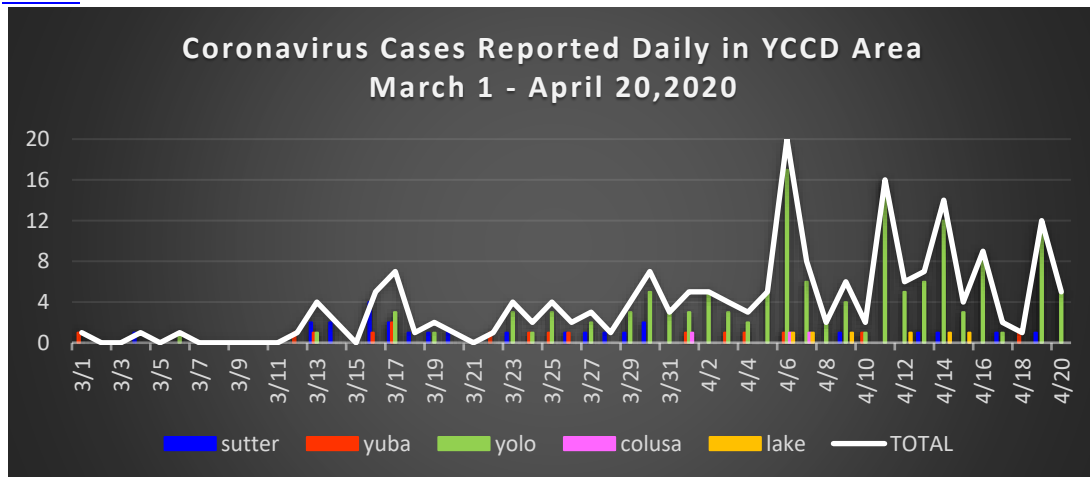
YCCD Daily Update

Tuesday, April 21, 2020

Daily Update provides information on the current status of the COVID-19 crisis related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information from both local, state and national media outlets.

CURRENT STATUS

As of this morning there were a total of 193 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the service area of Yuba Community College District; three in Colusa County, six in Lake County, 26 in Sutter County, 142 in Yolo County (73 of which are in Woodland) and 16 in Yuba County. That is an increase of 5 from yesterday's update. In Yolo County 1,462 people have been tested, Lake County 285, and in Yuba-Sutter Counties 1,329 people have been tested. Testing numbers for Colusa are not available. Statewide there are a total of 30,978 confirmed cases reported on April 19, 2020 according to the [California Department of Public Health](https://www.cdph.ca/Programs/CID/DCDC/Pages/Immunization/COVID-19/Pages/COVID-19-California-4-19-20.aspx).
