
YCCD Daily Update


Friday, April 24, 2020

Daily Update provides information on the current status of the COVID-19 crisis related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information from both local, state and national media outlets.

CURRENT STATUS

As of this morning there were a total of 204 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the service area of Yuba Community College District; three in Colusa County, six in Lake County, 28 in Sutter County, 151 in Yolo County (78 of which are in Woodland) and 16 in Yuba County. That is an increase of 2 from yesterday's update. In Yolo County 1,577 people have been tested, 438 in Lake County and 1,399 in Yuba-Sutter Counties 1. Testing numbers for Colusa are not available. Statewide there are a total of 37,369 confirmed cases reported on April 22, 2020 according to the California Department of Public Health.
