CURRENT STATUS

As of noon today there are a total of there were a total of 234 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of six cases in the past week. A total of 5,670 people have been tested in our region which is an increase of 34 percent over the past week. Currently there is 1 patients hospitalized on the District.

Statewide there are a total of 60,614 confirmed cases according to the [California Department of Public Health](#). That is a 23 percent increase over the previous week. A total of 875,272 tests have been completed in the state which is a 28 percent increase over the previous week.
