CURRENT STATUS

As of this morning there are a total of 262 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. A total of 8,984 people have been tested in our region which is an increase of 46% over the past week. Currently there is one patient hospitalized in the District. Statewide there are a total of 78,839 confirmed cases according to the [California Department of Public Health](#). That is an 18% increase over the previous week. A total of 1,235,243 tests have been completed in the state which is a 29% increase over the previous week. Individuals hospitalized have decreased by 7% and individuals in the ICU have decreased by 3%.
