

YCCD Friday Update

Friday, May 22, 2020

This Update provides information on COVID-19 related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. Updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Friday.

CURRENT STATUS

As of Thursday at 6pm there are a total of 270 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. Colusa – 4; Lake – 12; Sutter – 40; Yolo – 186 (89 in Woodland); and Yuba – 28. That is an increase of 5.8 percent over last week. A total of 9,819 people have been tested in our region which is an increase of 73.2% percent over the previous week. Currently there is one patient hospitalized in the District.

Statewide there are a total of 86,197 confirmed cases. That is a 17.8% increase over the previous week. A total of 1,421,127 tests have been completed in the state which is a 28.6% increase over the previous week. Individuals hospitalized have decreased by 2.5% and individuals in the ICU have decreased by 2.6%. Statewide data from the California Department of Public Health.
