YCCD Friday Update

Friday, May 29, 2020

This Update provides information on COVID-19 related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. Updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Friday.

CURRENT STATUS

As of Thursday at 6pm there are a total of 306 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. Colusa – 5; Lake – 23; Sutter – 42; Yolo – 207 (96 in Woodland); and Yuba – 2298. That is an increase of 13% over last week. A total of 11,762 people have been tested in Lake, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba Counties (Colusa data is not available) which is an increase of 21% percent over the previous week. Currently there is one patient hospitalized in the District.

Statewide there are a total of 101,697 confirmed cases. That is a 17.9% increase over the previous week. A total of 1,421,127 tests have been completed in the state which is a 26% increase over the previous week. Individuals hospitalized have increased by 2% and individuals in the ICU have increased by 1%. Statewide data from the California Department of Public Health.
