

YCCD Monday Memo

Monday, June 8, 2020

This Update provides information on COVID-19 related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. Updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Friday.

CURRENT STATUS

As of Sunday, June 7 there are a total of 350 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an 11.8% increase over the previous week. Current case totals are: Colusa – 7; Lake – 30; Sutter – 58; Yolo – 223 (100 in Woodland); and Yuba – 32. A total of 14,344 people have been tested in Lake, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba Counties (Colusa data is not available). That is a 14.9% increase over the previous week. Currently there are five patients hospitalized in the District.

Statewide there are a total of 128,812 confirmed cases, an increase of 16.5%. A total of 2,362,218 tests have been completed, an increase of 21.5%. There has been a 6.7% increase in hospitalizations and no increase in ICU patients.
