

YCCD Monday Memo

Monday, June 15, 2020

This Update provides information on COVID-19 related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. Updates during the summer are provided twice per week on Monday and Thursday.

CURRENT STATUS

As of Sunday, June 14 there are a total of 413 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the communities served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an 18% increase over the previous week. Current case totals are: Colusa – 7; Lake – 32; Sutter – 86; Yolo – 253 (120 in Woodland); and Yuba – 35. A total of 17,890 people have been tested in the counties. That is a 21.2% increase over the previous week. Currently there are six patients hospitalized in the service area of the District, an increase of 1 over the previous week. Local County is self-reported and available on each counties website.

Statewide there are a total of 148,855 confirmed cases, an increase of 15.6% over the previous week. A total of 2,801,996 tests have been completed, an increase of 18.6%. Total people currently hospitalized is 3,092, a 2.9% decrease and the number of ICU patients is 1,076, three less than last week.
