

# **YCCD Thursday Update**

**Thursday, June 18, 2020**

*This update provides information primarily on COVID-19 issues related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. During the summer updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Thursday.*

### **CURRENT STATUS**

As of June 18 at 11:00 am, there are a total of 463 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the counties served by the Yuba Community College District. That is a 27% increase over the previous week. Current confirmed case totals are: Colusa – 7, a 0% increase; Lake – 34, a 13% increase; Sutter – 92, a 37% increase; Yolo – 291, a 28% increase with 144 in Woodland, a 40% increase; and Yuba – 39, a 18% increase. A total of 19,582 people have been tested in our service area. That is a 19.1% increase over the previous week. Currently there are four patients hospitalized in the District, one less than last Friday.

As of 11:00 am today, statewide there are a total of 161,099 confirmed cases, an increase of 15.7% over the previous week. A total of 3,074,530 tests have been completed, an increase of 18.4%. A total of 3,439 individuals are hospitalized an increase of 7.9% and there are 1,119 in the ICU, a decrease of 17.5%. Since May 1, on a weekly basis, the number of cases have continued to increase and during that time the total of confirmed cases statewide has risen by 219%. During the same period the number of tests in the state have increased by 389%; the number of patients hospitalized has increased by .5% and the number of patients in ICU has decreased by 5%.

### **JUNETEENTH – FRIDAY, JUNE 19**

This weekend is the annual celebration of Juneteenth. The name combines the words *June* and *nineteenth*, the day in 1865 when enslaved Texans in Galveston were informed that slavery was over. Juneteenth is celebrated as a day of remembrance and opportunity for African-Americans to honor their history and celebrate their culture.
