

# YCCD Monday Memo

Monday, June 22, 2020

*This update provides information primarily on COVID-19 issues related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. During the summer updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Thursday.*

## NEW FACIAL COVERING ORDER IN CALIFORNIA

**It cannot be stressed enough: Wear facial covering, wash your hands, maintain social distance, and stay home if possible**

### CURRENT STATUS

As of Sunday, June 21 there are a total of 526 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the counties served by the Yuba Community College District. That is a 27% increase over the previous week, and the second week in a row with a double digit increase. Current case totals are: Colusa – 7, zero increase; Lake – 32, a 9% increase; Sutter – 112, a 30% increase; Yolo – 330, a 30% increase with 159 cases in Woodland, a 32% increase; and Yuba – 42, a 27% increase. A total of 21,745 people have been tested, an increase of 21% over the previous week. This is the first week since the last week of April where the testing increase did not exceed the increase in confirmed cases. Currently there are six patients hospitalized in the service area of the District, no change over the previous week. Counties self-reported and there data is available on each county website.

Statewide there are a total of 173,824 confirmed cases, an increase of 17% over the previous week. A total of 3,319,256 tests have been completed, an increase of 18.4%. Total people currently hospitalized are 3,574, a 16% increase and the number of ICU patients is 1,163, an increase of 8%.
