YCCD Monday Memo

Monday, June 29, 2020

This update provides information primarily on COVID-19 issues related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. During the summer updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Thursday.

CURRENT STATUS

As of Sunday, June 28 there are a total of 772 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five counties served by the Yuba Community College District. That is a 38.6% increase over the previous week, and the third week in a row with a double digit increase. Current case totals are: Colusa – 17, 142% increase; Lake – 51, a 38% increase; Sutter – 160, a 35% increase; Yolo – 479, a 36% increase with 212 cases in Woodland, a 33% increase; and Yuba – 65, a 51% increase. A total of 24,978 people have been tested, an increase of 15% over the previous week. Currently there are ten patients hospitalized in the service area of the District, and 28 fatalities, one more than the start of the month. (Most fatalities are attributed to a nursing home in Woodland.)

Statewide there are a total of 211,243 confirmed cases, an increase of 21% over the previous week. A total of 3,955,952 tests have been completed, an increase of 19.2%. Total people currently hospitalized are 4,577, a 28% increase and the number of ICU patients is 1,385, an increase of 19%.
