YCCD Monday Memo

Monday, July 6, 2020

This update provides information primarily on COVID-19 issues related to Yuba Community College District, and shares information, resources and news from local, state and national media outlets. During the summer updates are provided twice per week on Monday and Thursday.

CURRENT STATUS BY THE NUMBERS

As of Sunday, July 5, there were a total of 1,214 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five counties served by the Yuba Community College District. That is a 57% increase over the previous week, and the fourth week in a row with a double digit increase. Current case totals are: Colusa – 70, 312% increase; Lake – 87, a 71% increase; Sutter – 252, a 58% increase; Yolo – 677, a 41% increase with 317 cases in Woodland, a 50% increase; and Yuba – 128, a 97% increase. A total of 28,935 people have been tested, an increase of 16% over the previous week. Currently there are 27 patients hospitalized (170% increase) in the service area of the District, and 32 fatalities, four more than last week.

Statewide there are a total of 260,155 confirmed cases, an increase of 23% over the previous week. A total of 4,680,138 tests have been completed, an increase of 18%. Total people currently hospitalized are 5,669, a 24% increase and the number of ICU patients is 1,711, an increase of 24%.
