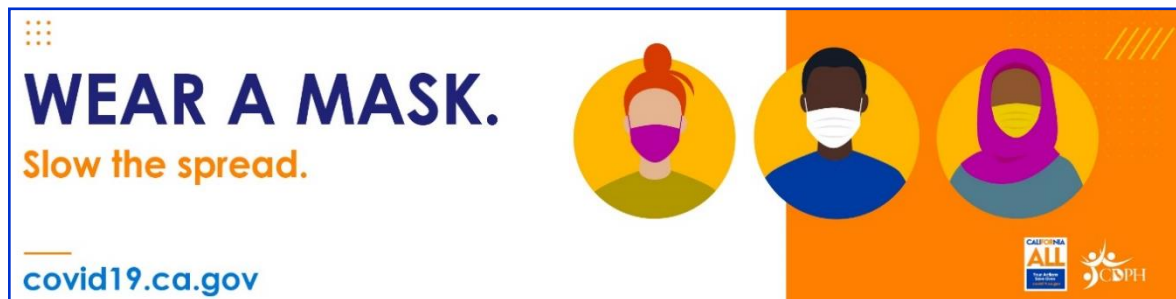

COVID-19 UPDATE

There are a total of 8,247 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county area served by the Yuba Community College District. That is a 5.0% increase over the previous week. Current case totals are: Colusa – 581, a 4.3 % increase; Lake – 746, a 2.6% increase; Sutter – 1,992, a 4.2% increase; Yolo – 3,494, a 5.8% increase with 1,463 cases in Woodland, a 3.9% increase; and Yuba – 1,434, a 6% increase. All counties rate of growth is higher than the previous week. Currently there are 21 patients hospitalized in our service area, 14 less than last week and there are five ICU patients, two less than last week. There have been 108 fatalities, three more than last week.

Statewide there are a total of 964,639 confirmed cases, an increase of 5.0% over the previous week. A total of 19,724,628 tests have been completed. Total patients currently hospitalized in the state are 2,902, a 17.3% increase and the number of ICU patients is 811, an increase of 16.2%. BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine the county risk level. The list is updated weekly on Tuesdays. For each level there is specific guidance related to business and community activity that can be found in the link above. **ALL counties of the YCC District are currently in Tier 2: SUBSTANTIAL.** Current Positivity rates are: Colusa – 1.8; Lake – 2.9; Sutter – 3.8; Yolo – 3.2; and Yuba 4.4. Current New Case Per 100,000 Population rates are: Colusa – 1.9; Lake – 3.3; Sutter – 6.3; Yolo – 7.2; and Yuba 7.6. The tiers in the Blueprint are:

Risk Level	Description	New Cases	Positive Tests
WIDESPREAD	Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	> 7 per 100K	>8%
SUBSTANTIAL	Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	4-7 per 100K	5-8%
MODERATE	Some indoor business operations are open w/ modifications	1-3.9 per 100K	2-4.9%
MINIMAL	Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	>1	>2%
