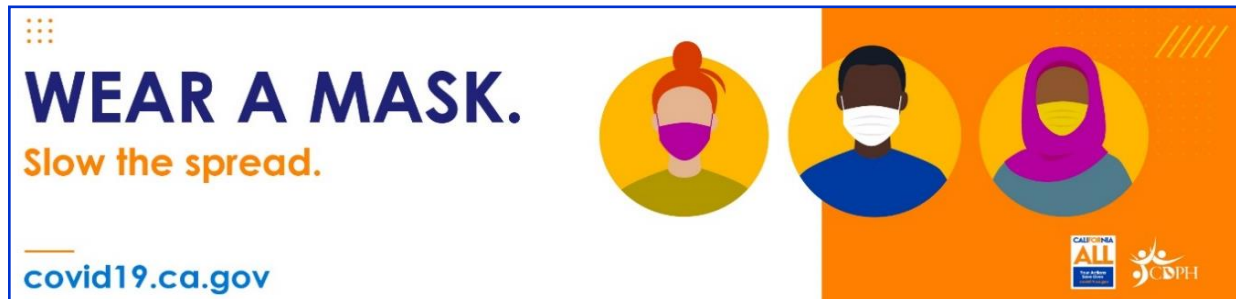

## COVID-19 UPDATE

There are a total of 8,923 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county area served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of 676 cases in the past week, an 8.2% increase over the previous week. That is the largest weekly increase since mid-August. Current case totals are: Colusa – 599, a 3.1 % increase; Lake – 776, a 4.0% increase; Sutter – 2,185, a 9.7% increase; Yolo – 3,814, a 9.2% increase with 1,600 cases in Woodland, a 9.4% increase; and Yuba – 1,549, a 8% increase. Currently there are 22 patients hospitalized in our service area, 1 more than last week and there are nine ICU patients, four more than last week. There have been 113 fatalities, five more than last week.

Statewide there are a total of 1,019,345 confirmed cases, an increase of 5.7% over the previous week. Total patients currently hospitalized in the state are 3,683, a 26.9% increase and the number of ICU patients is 1,001, an increase of 23.4%. ## BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY

[Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#) focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine the county risk level. The list is updated weekly on Tuesdays. For each level there is specific guidance related to business and community activity that can be found in the link above. **ALL counties of the YCC District are currently in Tier 2: SUBSTANTIAL.** It is expected that both Sutter and Yuba Counties will be moved back to the Purple (WIDESPREAD) Tier on November 17. Current Positivity rates and new case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier that number would fall into.

Risk Level	Description	New Cases	Positive Tests
WIDESPREAD	Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	> 7 per 100K	>8%
SUBSTANTIAL	Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	4-7 per 100K	5-8%
MODERATE	Some indoor business operations are open w/ modifications	1-3.9 per 100K	2-4.9%
MINIMAL	Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	>1	>2%
