COVID-19 STATUS IN YCCD SERVICE AREA

As of January 27, 2021 there are a total of 30,593 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county region served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of 4.6% during the past week, and the fifth consecutive of single digit percentage increases. Total cases are shown in the chart below. Increases by county during the past week were: Colusa – 3.5%; Lake – 4.5%; Sutter – 3.3%; Yolo – 4.5%, with a 4.6% increase in Woodland; and Yuba – 2.6%. 29,040 of the confirmed cases (94.9% of the total cases count) have been classified as recovered. The percentage of recovered patients has increased steadily since mid-December. Currently there are 1,553 active cases in the service area. County data is from local county website dashboards. Statewide there are a total of 3,294,447 confirmed cases, an increase of 3.4% over the previous week.

Currently there are 112 patients hospitalized in our service area, which is eleven less than last week. There are 20 patients in ICU, which is seven less than last week. There have been 326 fatalities, 21 more than last week.

Total patients hospitalized in the state is 13277, a 19.6% decrease from last week, and the number of ICU patients is 3,637, a 13.3% decrease. Statewide data is from the California Department of Public Health and can be found at https://data.chhs.ca.gov/.

ICU capacity rates across the state are starting to show an increase. Statewide capacity is above zero for the first time in more than a month. Regional ICU capacities as of February 2 are: Northern California – 24.4%; Greater Sacramento Region – 18.4%; Bay Area – 18.1%; San Joaquin Valley – 10.7%; Southern California – 9.1%. Combined statewide capacity is 11.7%.

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine a county's risk level. For each level there is specific guidance related to business and community activity. That information can be found in the link above. **Currently all counties in the YCCD District are in Tier 1, the most restrictive Tier**. Current Positivity and New Case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier that number would fall into.

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

As of February 4, a total of 41, 566 doses of COVID Vaccine have been administered in our five county region. Statewide a total of 3,984,752 doses have been administered. This represents 61.9% of the doses that are currently available in the state.
