COVID-19 STATUS IN YCCD SERVICE AREA

As of February 25, 2021 there are a total of 32,445 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county region served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of 1.7% over last Friday. Total cases are shown in the chart below. Increases by county since last Friday are: Colusa – .6%; Lake – 2.5%; Sutter – 1.2%; Yolo – 2.2%, with a 2.2% increase in Woodland; and Yuba – 1.5%. 31,248 of the confirmed cases (96.3% of the total cases count) have been classified as recovered. Currently there are 1,197 active cases in the service area. County data is from local county website dashboards. Statewide there are a total of 3,460,326 confirmed cases, an increase of .5% since last Friday.

Hospitalization continue to decline while ICU numbers show a slight increase. Currently there are 51 individuals hospitalized in our service area, which is 7 less than last week. There are 18 patients in ICU, which is two more than last Friday. There have been 371 fatalities, five more than last week.

Total patients hospitalized in the state is 5,934, an 11.5% decrease since last Friday. The number of ICU patients is 1,708, a 14.7% decrease since last week. Statewide data is from the California Department of Public Health and can be found at <https://data.chhs.ca.gov/>.

ICU available capacity rates across the state are continuing to increase. As of February 23, statewide capacity is 20.9%. Regional ICU capacities are: Northern California – 33.6%; Greater

Sacramento Region – 24.0%; Bay Area – 25.4%; San Joaquin Valley – 16.8%; Southern California – 19.5%.

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine a county's risk level. On Tuesday, February 23, **Yolo County was moved into Tier 2 – Substantial**. All other counties in the YCCD District are in Tier 1, the most restrictive Tier. We are starting to see some local number fall into the second and third tiers. Current Positivity and New Case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier that number would fall into.

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

Statewide there have been a total of 8,003,120 vaccine doses administered. Local county totals are: Yolo – 49,624; Sutter – 17,648; Lake – 11,326; Yuba – 8,662 and Colusa – 2,852.

Vaccine eligibility still varies somewhat county to county and seems to be in a constant state of change. Here is the latest as of February 25. Information is from county websites.

Yolo County (www.yolocounty.org/coronavirus-vaccine) Yolo County is currently in Phase 1b Tier 1. This includes all educational employees. To check availability of appointments and to register go to www.yolocounty.org/coronavirus-vaccine or call 2-1-1.

Sutter & Yuba Counties (www.yuba.org/vaccines and www.suttercounty.org/vaccine) Starting on Monday, March 1, Educational workers regardless of age will be eligible to receive the vaccine. Registration information for all vaccination clinics can be found online at: www.yuba.org/vaccines and www.suttercounty.org/vaccine. **YCCD employees working at the Yuba College Marysville Campus, Sutter Center, or district office do not need to be a resident of Yuba or Sutter County to receive the vaccine.** Workers will need to bring a letter from their employer or paystub to confirm employment AND an official ID (driver's license, passport, etc.) for age verification.

Colusa County (<https://www.countyofcolusa.org/771/COVID19>) Teachers, School Staff and Childcare Providers are eligible to be vaccinated. Colusa County Public Health will be coordinating with employers as vaccine becomes available.

Lake County (<http://health.co.lake.ca.us/Coronavirus/Vaccines.htm>) Lake County is vaccinating healthcare workers, long-term care residents who qualify under Phase 1A and in Phase 1B, residents age 65 and older and “those at risk of exposure at work in education who work or live in Lake County.” Online scheduling can be done at the above website.

Information on neighboring county's vaccination programs

Butte County (<http://www.buttecounty.net/ph/COVID19/vaccine>) Butte County is in Phase 1B and educators are eligible.

Nevada County (<https://www.mynevadacounty.com/3148/Get-Vaccine-Information>) Nevada County is only vaccinating individuals age 65 and above. Vaccine alerts and updates on eligibility are available by texting VACCINEINFO to 898211.

Placer County (<https://www.placer.ca.gov/vaccine>) Placer County is vaccinating educators that

live and work in Placer County. To stay informed about vaccine availability residents can visit www.placer.ca.gov/vaccine; or text PLACERVACCINE to the number 898211 to receive text alerts from 211.

Sacramento County (<https://www.saccounty.net/COVID-19/Pages/CoronavirusVaccine.aspx>)
Educators are eligible to be vaccinated. Information on accessing vaccinations is being shared through the school districts in the county.

Solano County (https://solanocounty.com/depts/ph/coronavirus_links/covid_19_vaccines.asp)
Educators are eligible for vaccination in Solano County. The County has a [vaccine interest form](#) that they use to pre-screen and inform individuals that are eligible to be vaccinated.

YUBA COLLEGE CDC

The Yuba College Childcare Center is open and they have spaces available for children 18 months to 5 years of age. They are a state funded program and fees are calculated by a sliding scale. Most of our families have no fees. Those eligible are families that have children under CPS, students, parents who are employed or seeking employment, incapacitated, or 3-hour state preschool for education/socialization. If you know anyone interested or in need of a good childcare program have them contact Renee McKenzie at rmckenzie@yccd.edu. The site does take the safety of students and staff very seriously. They conduct a health check of all staff and children every morning. Children 3 year of age, and older wear facial coverings as well as the staff. We follow all the guidelines from our health department and state licensing agency ensuring we do our best in keeping the children healthy.




