COVID-19 STATUS IN YCCD SERVICE AREA

As of March 11, 2021 there are a total of 33,069 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county region served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of .8% over last week. Total cases are shown in the chart below. Increases by county since last week are: Colusa – .7%; Lake – 2.1%; Sutter – .7%; Yolo – 1.1%, with a .9% increase in Woodland; and Yuba – 1.1%. 32,428 of the confirmed cases (98.1% of the total cases count) have been classified as recovered. Currently there are 641 active cases in the service area. County data is from local county website dashboards. Statewide there are a total of 3,516,862 confirmed cases, an increase of .8% since last week.

Hospitalization and ICU patient rates continue to decline across the state and locally. Currently there are 32 individuals hospitalized in our service area, which is 9 less than last week. There are 12 patients in ICU, which is two less than last week. There have been 385 fatalities, 12 more than last week.

Total patients hospitalized in the state is 3,477, a 8.8% decrease since last week. The number of ICU patients is 961, a 12.6% decrease since last week and the first time the number is below 1,000 since mid-October. ICU available capacity rates across the state are continuing to increase. As of March 9, statewide capacity is 26.7%. Regional ICU capacities are: Northern California – 37.3%; Greater Sacramento Region – 23.1%; Bay Area – 27.2%; San Joaquin Valley – 21.3%; Southern California – 27.6%.

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine a county’s risk level. On Tuesday, February 23, **Yolo County was moved into Tier 2 – Substantial**. **All other counties in the YCCD District are in Tier 1, the most restrictive Tier**. We are starting to see some local number fall into the second and third tiers. Current Positivity and New Case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier that number would fall into.

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

Statewide there have been a total of 10,988,301 vaccine doses administered. That represents 27.6% of the state’s population. Local county totals are: Yolo – 65,554 (29.6% of population); Sutter – 23,914 (24.2%); Lake – 16,147 (24.8%); Yuba – 11,902 (15.4%) and Colusa – 4,156 (18.3%).

Vaccine administration somewhat county to county and seems to be in a constant state of change. All counties in our service area are vaccinating educational workers at this time. Please check with your local county website for the latest vaccine information.
