COVID-19 STATUS IN YCCD SERVICE AREA

As of March 14, 2021 there are a total of 33,118 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county region served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of 1.0% over last Sunday. Total cases are shown in the chart below. Increases by county since last Sunday are: Colusa – .6%; Lake – 1.7%; Sutter – .6%; Yolo – 1.1%, with a .8% increase in Woodland; and Yuba – 1.0%. 32,480 of the confirmed cases (98.1% of the total cases count) have been classified as recovered. Currently there are 638 active cases in the service area. County data is from local county website dashboards. Statewide there are a total of 3,526,335 confirmed cases, an increase of .7% since last Sunday.

Currently there are 30 individuals hospitalized in our service area, which is 11 less than last week. There are 11 patients in ICU, which is three less than last week. There have been 386 fatalities, ten more than last week.

Total patients hospitalized in the state is 3,477, a 8.8% decrease since last Sunday. The number of ICU patients is 961, a 12.6% decrease since last week. Statewide data is from the California Department of Public Health and can be found at https://data.chhs.ca.gov/.

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine a county's risk level. As of March 14, Yolo and Colusa Counties are in Tier 2 of the state's reopening plan. In a March 12 <u>Press Release</u> from the California Department of Public Health the stated that, "based on current data and

projections" they expect Lake, Sutter and Yuba will be moved from Purple to Red on Tuesday, March 15. Current Positivity and New Case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier that number would fall into.

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

Statewide there have been a total of 11,785,750 vaccine doses administered. That represents 29.6% of the state's population. Local county totals are: Yolo -68,733 (31.0% of population); Sutter -24,986 (25.3%); Lake -17,109 (26.3%); Yuba -13,429 (17.3%) and Colusa -4,753 (20.9%).

Vaccine administration somewhat county to county and seems to be in a constant state of change. All counties in our service area are vaccinating educational workers at this time. Please check with your local county website for the latest vaccine information.
