COVID-19 STATUS IN YCCD SERVICE AREA

As of April 11, 2021 there are a total of 34,171 confirmed cases of coronavirus in the five county region served by the Yuba Community College District. That is an increase of .8% over last week's total. Total cases are shown in the chart below. Increases by county since last week are: Colusa – .6%; Lake – .5%; Sutter – .5%; Yolo – 1.0%, with a 1.0 % increase in Woodland; and Yuba – .7%. 33,631 of the confirmed cases (98.4% of the total cases count) have been classified as recovered. Currently there are 540 active cases in the service area. County data is from local county website dashboards. Statewide there are a total of 3,600,178 confirmed cases.

Hospitalization and ICU patient rates have leveled off locally. Currently there are 14 individuals hospitalized in our service area, three less than last Monday. There are five patients in ICU, which is two less than last week. There have been 400 fatalities, one more than last week.

Total patients hospitalized in the state is 1,799. The number of ICU patients is 434. Both of those numbers are the lowest they have been since early months of the pandemic. Statewide data is from the California Department of Public Health and can be found at <https://data.chhs.ca.gov/>.

Blueprint for a Safer Economy focuses on *New Daily Cases per 100,000 Population* and *Percentage of Tests that are Positive* to determine a county's risk level. As of March 30, **Colusa and Yolo Counties are in Tier 3**, and **Sutter, Lake and Yuba are in Tier 2**. Current Positivity and New Case rates are shown on the above table. The color of the number indicates what tier

that number falls into.

Risk Level	Description	New Cases	Positive Tests
WIDESPREAD	Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	> 10 per 100K	>8%
SUBSTANTIAL	Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	5-10 per 100K	5-8%
MODERATE	Some indoor business operations are open w/ modifications	1-4.9 per 100K	2-4.9%
MINIMAL	Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	<1	<2%

COVID VACCINE UPDATE

Statewide there have been a total of 22,777,893 vaccine doses have been administered. 6,294,860 individuals are partially vaccinated and 8,767,321 individuals have been fully vaccinated. Those two numbers represent 38.8% of the state's population. Vaccinations totals in our five county region are: Colusa – 9,428 (41.5% of population); Lake – 33,694 (51.7%); Sutter – 49,089 (49.7%); Yolo – 139,323 (62.9%); and Yuba – 26,382 (34%).

Please check with your local county website for the latest vaccine information. **As of April 1, all California residents age 50 and older are eligible for vaccination. 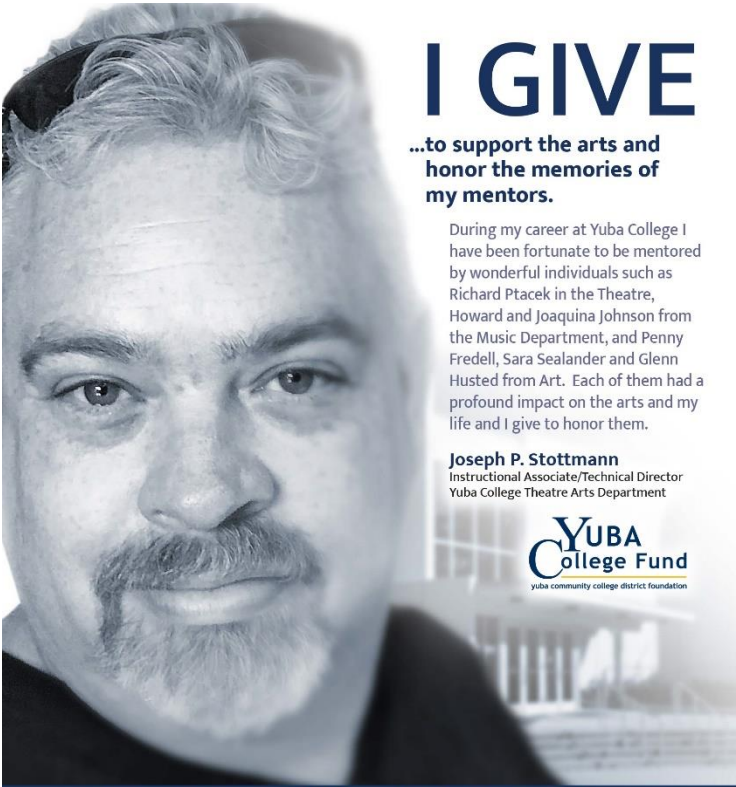
