

Federal law requires Yuba Community College District to post information regarding the CARES Act, Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Awards.

Each institution who received HEERF funds must comply with Section 18004(e) of the CARES Act and submit an initial report (the "30-day Fund Report") to the Secretary thirty (30) days from the date of the institution's Certification and Agreement to the Department and provide updates, every 45 days after that. Each HEERF participating institution must post the information listed below on the institution's primary website in a format and location that is easily accessible to the public.

The 7 required reporting elements are:

(1) Yuba Community College District affirms that Yuba College has signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement of assurance that the institution will use, or intend to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

(2) The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

- Yuba College has received \$10,726,400.00

(3) The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission.

CARES Act as of Fall 2021:

- Yuba College Total funds disbursed \$2,285,584 for Fall 2021 (Q4)

(4) The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

- Yuba College Total: 3,584 as of Fall 2021

(5) The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

- Yuba College Total Recipients 3,584 for Fall 2021 (Q4)

(6) The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Criteria for Fall 2021 Disbursement (only need to fall into one of the following categories):

- AB 540
- Students with Disabilities
- Students who are enrolled in or have completed college or transfer-level English and/or Math
- Students enrolled in at least 1 ESL or ESOL course
- All other students who are enrolled in at least 6 units
- Students in TRiO, CalWORKs, EOPS/CARE, Food Pantry, Military Affiliation, Promise (BOG)
- FAFSA Status as Independent with At Least One Dependent

(7) Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
